On May 15, 2003 our Sister Agonian, Barbara Ingram Millson, was laid to rest. Barbara was born in Bronxville, NY but most of her life was lived joyously in Whitesboro, NY (a Utica). suburb of Barbara received her Degree BA from SUNY Potsdam in

1969 and her MS in Education from SUNY Cortland. She taught third grade for 33 years in Westmoreland Central School District. She was an active member of the Westmoreland Teachers Association serving as their president for a number of years. She was also a member of NYSUT. Barb was an avid golfer and during the warmer seasons could be found happily engaged in a game of golf.

Sue Wajda '74 writes that she discovered this Agonian while Barbara was looking at computer printouts of all the Agos. Sue's dad, Ted Wajda, scouted for Sue since he lived two doors away from Barb in Whitesboro. Barb and Ted immediately fell for one another and adopted each other as father and daughter. Barb instantly became Sue's second sister.

Ted Wajda was a wonderful "dad" and neighbor to Barbara helping her with household fix-ups, snowplowing, etc. Mom Wajda often cooked for her and Barbara soon was part of many Wajda holiday dinners.

One alumnae weekend Ted coaxed Barb to drive up to Potsdam for the

day (a 3½ hour drive) to help Sue clean the Ago house and welcome returning sisters. After that trip, Barb was hooked.

Eventually Barbara became a member of the Agonian Board of Directors with her emphasis on maintenance of the Ago house, working with repairmen and active House Managers to spruce up 11 Pierrepont Avenue.





## Dr. Susan Smykla Udell '57 Recipient of 2003 Minerva Award

We are proud to report that the 2003 Minerva Award was presented to our very own Agonian Sister, **Susan Smykla Udell '57**. After graduating from SUNY Potsdam, Susan earned her master's degree in piano and a Ph.D. in music education and choral literature from the University of Wisconsin.

Susan's resume is full and includes teaching and directing many prestigious musical ensembles. Her numerous positions include music director of the Madison Area Concert Handbells, teacher of class piano through the University of Wisconsin Extension, executive director and later assistant director and accompanist of the Madison Boychoir, assistant director and accompanist of the Madison Diocesan Choir, music director at Asbury United Methodist Church, a mother/daughter singing group called the Wisconsin Holiday Choral that performed for the governor, at the White House, and in Europe.

On top of all her work as a music educator, conductor, and administrator, Susan and her husband Jon raised six wonderful children.

The Minerva Award is the highest honor that the Alumni Association bestows upon our Potsdam graduates and is given in recognition of outstanding professional achievement. 

## Agonian Alumnae Scholarships

The Agonian Alumnae Scholarships for the 2003-2004 school year have been awarded. The **Eunice "Brownie" Badger** Scholarship is awarded to the sister who exemplifies Agonian Sisterhood while demonstrating excellence in service to the college and community. This year the award is presented to Jamie Sico.

Jamie was a member of the Spring 2002 pledge class and has lived at 11 Pierrepont Avenue for two years. She has served as Senior Inter-Sorority Council representative, member of Pledge Committee, and Social Treasurer. At SUNY Potsdam, Jamie is a trumpet player majoring in music education. She has performed with the Crane Wind Ensemble for three semesters and the Crane Concert Band as principal trumpet.

Jamie also participates in college athletics. This is her fourth year on the women's tennis team, last year as team captain and this year as co-captain. She has received All academic and All-Conference academic honors while on the team. Jamie has been on the Dean's List or President's List each semester at Potsdam.

In her community at home, Jamie has played an active role in sup-

porting Cystic Fibrosis research. She has participated in many walk-a-thons and Chinese Auctions to raise money for a disease that affects a family friend. Jamie has also supported the Breast Cancer Foundation in honor of her late grandmother, and recently participated in a cancer relay, an allnight walk.

During the past three summers, Jamie has worked at a developmental disabilities institute, a pre-kindergarten program for Autism and other developmental disabilities.

Fall 2003 averages were recently reported as follows: Average Cumulative Female GPA is 2.94. Average Fall Semester female GPA is 3.00. Agonian ranked fourth among the sororities in both average Fall '03 GPA and cumulative. Agonian's Fall semester average is 2.37 and the cumulative average is 2.47.






Faculty and students will soon have a new Steinway concert grand piano in Hosmer Hall thanks to the generosity of faculty emeritus Brock McElheran, who recently made a major gift to The Campaign for Potsdam in honor of his wife, Jane. The goal of The Crane Fund portion of the Campaign is to raise resources for the training of young musicians, whether in the classroom, the concert hall, or the opera house, by creating a fund to replace, upgrade and maintain the school's exceptional collection of musical instruments. McElheran joined the SUNY Potsdam faculty in 1947 and continued teaching and conducting until his retirement in 1988. He was held in the highest regard during his tenure as conductor of Crane Chorus. His wife, Janie, served as librarian at the Congdon Campus School for almost 40 years, lending him tremendous support and assistance.

SUNY Potsdam's "The Campaign for Potsdam" has passed the \$10.5 million milestone in gifts and pledges, representing 88 percent of the Campaign goal. The five-year, \$12 million capital campaign is an investment in the core values of the College - People, Learning and Service. Private support is critical to Potsdam's mission of combining the highest quality education with a safe, attractive campus to create an outstanding learning experience for each student.

SUNY Potsdam will receive \$550,000 to fund its proposed "New York City Initiative: Music Educators for New York City" to provide music educators for New York City public schools. This project brings together the resources and talents of SUNY Potsdam, the VH1 Save The Music Foundation and the New York City Board of Education to address the critical need for music educators in New York City. The funding was obtained for the College through the diligent efforts of U.S. Senator Hillary Rodham Clinton, in partnership with Congressman John McHugh.
