Agonian Sorority's Impact On Potsdam's Colleges and Community

Letter from Nancy Griffin to the Agonian Alumnae Association:

Dear Ago Alumnae,

As a new Honorary member of Ago, I was very proud when asked to write

about ways in which Ago has had an impact on our colleges and the Potsdam community. I am happy to do so because it gives me an opportunity to say thank you for all that you have done—and continue to do—to make Potsdam the wonderful place that it is.

Although I am fairly new to the Ago community—I became an Honorary just last year—I have been part of the Potsdam community for almost 23

years, both as an employee of SUNY Potsdam and resident of the Village of Potsdam with my husband Michael, who has been employed at Clarkson University for 20 years. We consider ourselves very fortunate to be able to live here and make our living in such a special place.

Potsdam is special for many reasons, but chief among them is the strong sense of community—the idea that we are all neighbors, whether we are permanent residents or just here for a short period of time while earning a college degree—and good neighbors take care of each other. We are very lucky to have many good neighbors, including Ago, who are willing to pitch in to help others in need.

I am very impressed by Ago's community service activities each year, such as participating in Derby Days to raise funds for the Children's Miracle Network, volunteering for the American Red Cross blood drive, hosting a Halloween Party for children from needy families, helping with a food

drive for St. Mary's Church, conducting a domestic violence awareness campaign for Renewal House, and staffing a table at the Student Union to collect donations for Hospice once a week. These are just a few of the many examples of the ways that Ago actives have contributed our community.

As I reflect on Ago's many community service projects, I realize that the term "actives" is an

appropriate one. They are, in fact, very active in the life of the sorority as well as the life of their college and village community. I also realize that the reason they are so actively involved is that they have such strong role models in their alumnae who set a wonderful example to follow. Looking through "The Anchor", I am happy to see that so many of you are involved in volunteer activities in your community. You are an inspiration to the actives as they prepare to leave the Potsdam community and become members of the communities where they will live and work.

I am also privileged to work directly with many of you in my role as Director (Continued on page 30)



Congratulations, Michelle and Jenna. Your sister Agonians applaud you, your accomplishments, and wish you many more.


Laurena Ramsdell Remembered:




