Remembrances from Gloria Groocock

After leaving Potsdam I visited it in '62 and '63 for special occasions and to meet up with old friends still there. At the time, it felt as if I had never left. It was interesting to hear of the different directions all our lives have taken and how everyone agreed that our education at Potsdam had prepared us very well for our futures.

We understand the Ago actives attended in full force!

"Goose" was not only a member of Ago, but while in Potsdam she served on Student Senate and as Administrative Vice President with the Student Government Association, was an R.A. and cheerleader.

# **Agonian Alumnae Association Scholarship Program**

When you pledge Ago, you join a long tradition, dating back to our founding as the Calliopean Literary Society in 1882, of excellence in academics, service, and leadership. Our ideals help us to succeed as students and prepare us for successful professional lives, in which we continue to lead and be of service to our community. Recognizing this excellence, Potsdam College's Alumni Association has presented three Agonian Alumnae with the esteemed Minerva Award for demonstrating outstanding lifetime professional achievement. Six Agonian Alumnae have been honored with the Distinguished Service Award for exceptional contributions to the College. Potsdam College also calls its alumni into service on its boards. We are proud that Ardra Cavanaugh Rogers, Class of 1929, who served as Ago's first president, went on to become the first president of Potsdam's Alumni Association, as well as its first Distinguished Service recipient. Continuing her legacy, two Agonian Alumnae currently serve on the Foundation Board and two serve as Alumni Trustees. We encourage you to carry these ideals with you after college as well.

Presenting scholarships to our undergraduate Sisters at Potsdam and Clarkson, an Agonian Alumnae Association tradition of more than thirty years, supports these ideals. In May of 1978, we recognized our Honorary, Laurena Ramsdell, a long-standing member of our Board of Directors who served as our financial advisor and auditor, by creating our first named \$100 scholarship in her honor. Laurena's scholarship is awarded to an Agonian who makes "outstanding contributions to her Sorority while showing academic excellence."

Upon the death of Eunice "Brownie" Badger, our spunky advisor who worked tirelessly with us from 1921-1983, we created a new scholarship in her memory. Brownie challenged us to maintain high standards and energetically guarded both the membership and the House (even showing up for breakfast at 5 AM!). She coordinated our newsletter, keeping our alumnae data base on little file cards that we assisted her in updating as we attended work sessions at her home each Saturday. In 1991, we awarded Brownie's scholarship to recognize an Agonian who "exemplifies service to our Sorority as well as to the Potsdam community."

In 2004, we added a third scholarship to recognize the leadership of the Agonian Alumnae Association founder Suzanne Wajda, Class of 1974 at Potsdam and recipient of her MBA from Clarkson in 1976. Sue served as President of the Agonian Alumnae Association from 1976-2001, working with the College to preserve and uphold our Greek traditions. Sue's scholarship recognizes a sister who "exemplifies the Agonian sisterhood while demonstrating excellence in leadership."

Over the years, the generosity and commitment of our Alumnae enabled us to increase our three scholarships to \$1000. As exciting as this was to both the Alumnae and the Actives, we found that annual donations would not fund all three scholarships. While we wish we could continue awarding all three, we instead now offer one \$1000 scholarship, inviting the Actives to apply for any of the three named scholarships. We hope this financial support is appreciated and that, as our Sisters transition to the ranks of Alumnae, they, too, will support our scholarship fund. We invite the Class of 2011 to volunteer for next year's Scholarship Committee, and we encourage all of our Ago Sisters to apply for next year's scholarship.

As our Scholarship Committee reads through the applications and accompanying letters of recommendation from faculty, we marvel each year at the GPA's, service projects, and leadership endeavors of our Ago Sisters. They are committed to their studies, yet make time to impact their college community in so many ways. We know they are on their way to becoming successful leaders and responsible members of society, and we are so proud to call all of them our Sisters.

# 2011 Agonian Alumnae Association Scholarship Award

This year we were honored to present the Eunice "Brownie" Badger Scholarship for Excellence in Service to Katie Beck, a junior from Macedon majoring in Early Childhood and Childhood Education. Dr. Marta Albert of the School of Education sponsored Katie's application. This year's scholarship winner has internalized the service goals of both Ago and Potsdam College and supports their programs with much energy. We asked Katie how service to others impacts her life, and she mentioned Ago's involvement with the Cecile Garden Project. Helping to plant and harvest vegetables for those in need shows her how much a few hours of volunteering can mean to those who struggle to buy food for their families. Her mother encourages her to make a difference in the lives of others, and this project enables her to put that philosophy into action. She also personally connects to Ago's fundraising for Hospice, as her grandfather was supported by this wonderful organization, and she sees firsthand how much their work is needed in the community. Inspired by her mother, Katie finds motivation in this quote: "So many people are expecting a miracle, instead of being a miracle." Participating in Ago's Service Projects challenges her to "become this "miracle" in someone else's life." After pledging Ago, she better understands herself, and her sorority involvement strengthens her desire to be of service to others.

This year we also asked our applicants to propose a Service Project for Ago. Katie suggests connecting with child cancer patients. Beyond financial support, she would like to see her Sisters travel to a children's hospital to interact with the patients, providing friendship and giving them the opportunity to play or do crafts like healthy children would do. She expects that her Sisters would also learn from these children, as their strength as they fight this disease would be most inspirational. We challenge Katie to put this plan into action!

Katie hopes to participate in the Jamaica Fields Service Project. While on this ten-day trip, she will help young children with literacy, create lesson plans, and donate school supplies. In recommending her for this scholarship, Dr. Marta Albert, of the Literacy Education Department, stated, "It is clear from her interest in the study abroad project that she is making connections between local service projects, her major academic interests, and the need to develop global awareness as a young person in an increasingly globalized world. Her interests reflect her compassionate nature; further, they show she is a problem-solver, someone who jumps in to be part of improvement projects and not someone who merely talks about the need for them."

Constance Ann Walker Bush ('82) passed away on January 26, 2011 at home in Va. after a one year battle with cancer. On this sad day the Class of '82 lost a very special friend. This is written in loving memory of our dear friend, Connie.

Connie came to Potsdam in the Fall '78. Fall '79 she pledged Ago and became a very active Ago sister immediately upon returning to Potsdam in January '80. In one of the first meetings that we attended as new members, the President was asking for volunteers and Connie's hand shot into the air. A nudge and a hint – "Hey, remember we just finished pledging? We were going to focus on our school work this semester!?" She gave a very stern look and that was that. She was off and running. Many committees and volunteering opportunities later we knew that we had a true leader. Spring '81 she wondered about running for President. Undoubtedly she would make a great President but did she want to take on all that responsibility? Another stern look and she was headlong into the process before we could blink an eye. And what a President! Every group has ups and downs but Connie was steadfast and true to the Agonian sisterhood. She loved everything about the sisterhood-our traditions, songs, blazers, blues! And did that girl know Parliamentary procedure! All meetings were conducted by the book but with the sense of fun that was Connie's unique way.

Connie didn't let a day pass without fitting in some laughter. She loved to be silly at times, but she was always witty! Living at the house was an outstanding experience our senior year and once again she was a leader among the members living at the house. There were 21 of us living in the house that year and Connie was like a mom to us all. We often called her "Mother Ago".

Connie was a very spiritual person. She attended church regularly throughout college. She would often ask others if they wanted to attend with her – not to try to convert anybody, but she knew when it might do you good – whether as a needed break from studies or a moment to reflect.

After graduation, Connie went on to Paralegal Studies and a couple years after graduation from her studies, she met and married her husband Bart. Bart and Connie had 5 children – all boys. She was a devoted wife and mother. She continued her volunteering after college - Syracuse Opera, Junior League, and at her various churches and children's schools. Once again, Connie's hand was in the air!

As Connie's struggle with this disease neared its end, the sisters gathered on email and Facebook to remember the happy times we shared in that house on Pierrepont Avenue. As we all commented on how sad we were, we reflected on the renewed communication between us. As one lovely sister put it so well -"Connie is working her magic again."

We were all so blessed to have known this beautiful, generous, and loving person. The Class of '82 will forever miss our beloved friend, Connie; our "Mother Ago".

#### **CLASS OF 1948**

Church and community activities manage to keep her busy along with keeping up a way too big 120 year old home, with time out for some traveling to far away places. "There you are Beryl. Rita Pangborn Osborn sent news from graduation to the present! Two month's after graduation from Potsdam State, she found herself living and working at the graduate dorm at Smith College in Northampton, Mass. She was already working on an M.A. in Music Fellowship engineered by Helen Hosmer and William Scotchood, the Music Ed Chair at Smith. The fellowship paid for a M.A. in Music of two year's tuition at Smith, room and board and \$12.50 spending money. For that she had to teach all the music classes at Smith College Day School, Grades 1-8, and did accompanying for the Smith Glee Club. Rita even had Albert Einstein for Mozart and Schubert history - and notes that he was a wonderful person as was Werner Joston, her music comp, teacher who also directed the Smith-Amherst Orchestra. 


