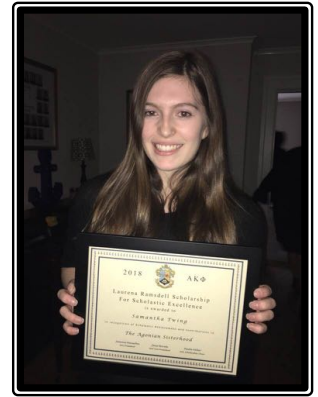


Alumnae Scholarship Awarded

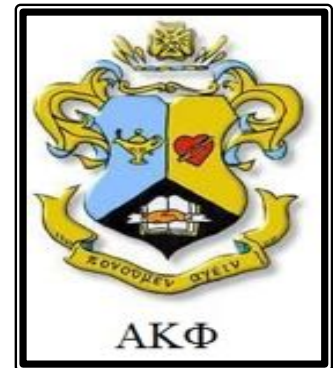
