It's election time again!

Our Governance documents strive to make the election process very transparent. We have term limits and each **AAA** officer can serve only 2 consecutive terms. Terms begin August 1. Open positions for the AAA are:

President – Two year term, limit of two consecutive terms. Main responsibilities:

- Oversee AAA Officers, recruit committee chairs.
- Lead annual meeting, other meetings, phone calls, conference calls and emails.
- Be an active participant on Agonian Board of Directors

• Communicate with the Active Sisters about newsletter and scholarship, also with Board members.

Vice President – two year term, limit of two consecutive terms. Main responsibilities:

- Facilitate the Reunion Weekend Committee and Newsletter Committee.
- Recruit class reps to collect news.
- Participate in regular meetings, phone calls, emails etc. with AAA.

Assist President and perform President duties when President unable to perform.

Communications Director – Two year term, limit of two consecutive terms. Main responsibilities:

- Maintain an updated database of addresses and emails of all Agonian Alumnae.
- Email the Anchor working with the Newsletter Team, requests for dues and reunion notifications.
- Coordinate all social media accounts.
- Maintain the Agonian website information from the AAA, Board of Directors, and Actives.

There are also two **Board of Directors** positions up for re-election:

Treasurer - Three year term, limit of two consecutive terms. Main responsibilities:

- Prepare an annual operating budget for the Corporate home for approval.
- Issue leases for residents of 11 Pierrepont Ave; collect security deposits and rent.
- Oversee deposit of all monies received by the Agonian Sorority Inc.

- Ensure payment of all approved expenses incurred by the Agonian Sorority Inc.
- Help to oversee House repairs, especially code enforcement.
- Advise and monitor all financial activities of the Active Members.

House Repair Manager - Three year term, limit of two consecutive terms. Main responsibilities:

- Serve as liaison to Active Member House Manager.
- Oversee all House repairs and review all improvement suggestions coming from both the Actives and the Board with the assistance of the Board Treasurer.
- Gather three bids for repairs and present bids to Board for approval.
- Manage all major 11 Pierrepont improvements and initiatives.
- Keep a record of annual repairs

Nominees for Board positions are strongly recommended to have served on the Agonian Sorority Board or in an Alumnae Association Office or Committee or in another capacity for a year.

As the saying goes "many hands make light work". I have volunteered to take on the class representative responsibilities, so the girls of '84 can expect to hear from me. I hope that many of you will choose to come back for an Ago-centered reunion and have the same positive experience that I had.
