NOTICE ABOUT CLARKSON REUNION

As Sisters may have heard via email or Facebook, Clarkson has decided to move their summer reunion to June 22nd-23rd, 2024, so it will not coincide with Ago's summer reunion. Clarkson is hoping to increase attendance by avoiding alumni "summer plans"; they also want to reduce the number of their alumni that have conflicts with other local reunions, and they don't want to fight for limited resources due to SUNY Potsdam's reunion and Potsdam Summer Festival that are held in July (they have trouble renting tents, getting caterers, etc.).

Obviously, Ago is disappointed with this decision as we have alumnae from both schools; this causes conflicts for Clarkson sisters that might want to attend events at both their school and their sorority house. It also creates a conflict for Potsdam-Clarkson couples, who may now have to choose which reunion to attend. The AAA has reached out to share our opinions and reasoning with several Clarkson directors. They have been responsive and have reached out to us personally, however, Clarkson is not reconsidering the date for 2024. In the Fall of 2023, the AAA reached out to our Clarkson ladies over email and Facebook. Unfortunately, we did not get many responses; we got very little interest in opening the Ago house for events, and even less interest in volunteering to help with these efforts. Therefore, we are sad to announce that the house will not be open, and there will not be any events at Ago during the Clarkson reunion weekend in June.

From the Ship's Galley: Honorary Elaine Patraw: Ago House Cook

Many of you will recognize the smiling face of **Honorary Elaine Patraw** who graced our ship's galley for a decade from the mid-70's to the mid-80's. Before the 2023 reunion, some sisters were reminiscing and raised the question of "where's Elaine?" Well, it turned out, she hadn't gone far, and we found her in Waddington. She came out to join us on the porch during the summer reunion.

The AAA recently caught up with Elaine and talked with her about her life and her involvement in Ago. Elaine was born in the Utica area and spent time up near Brushton where her father was a farm worker. They later lived outside of Potsdam where she met her husband Roy who she married in 1957. Roy worked for 42 years as a foreman and supervisor at Clarkson's heating plant.

Elaine worked as our cook from 1974–1984. She really enjoyed being a cook at the house, and it gave her the flexibility to care for her adopted son, Craig. Elaine said that most of the girls were great and took good care of the kitchen. Some memories she shared from her time at Ago included making homemade donuts and an assortment of casseroles... one for each table in the dining room. She recalled with appreciation how one class gifted her with a beautiful engraved locket, and recollects being made an Honorary along with the beloved, late Father Kellogg.

After working at Ago, Elaine and Roy sold their farm and built a house across the road. Elaine operated a square-dancing shop from the house and had a trailer to travel to square-dancing events. Later, she sold her business and spent many years watching three children in her neighborhood that have become her "extra" grandchildren.

At 84 years of age, Elaine has not stopped. Sadly, she lost her husband Roy in 2019. Elaine has been volunteering for many years at the food bank at the Waddington Resource Center, which has now re-located to the former Waddington Elementary school building that also houses Elaine's apartment.

This past holiday season, Elaine helped put together 70 holiday bundles for families in need. There is also a thrift shop that raises funds to buy food to supplement what is donated.

The AAA thinks a great way to honor Elaine, and the work she did for Ago, would be to make a donation to the Waddington Resource Center if you are able. Monetary donations are appreciated as Elaine says there are always items that need to be purchased. Ago's Deep Dark Past

The Agonian Sorority at Potsdam is an outgrowth of the Calliopean Literary Society founded in 1882. In 1921, **Eunice** (**Brownie**) **Badger** was initiated into the Calliopean Literary Society and served as Faculty Advisor for 62 years. In 1926, the members of the Calliopean Literary Society became the Zeta Gamma Upsilon local Sorority with **Audra Cavanaugh Rogers** as **President**.

On December 8, 1928, the members became the Gamma Chapter of the Agonian Sorority. In 1946 the Sorority incorporated as a State Sorority, and the house at 11 Pierrepont was purchased. In January 1955, the chapters disbanded, so it is presently known as the Agonian Sorority, a local sorority. Fall 1972 marked the initiation of the first Clarkson members. The Agonian Alumnae Association was formed in 1976 by **Sue Wajda** '74 and at present, there are over 1500 members. The Gamma Chapter was relaunched in the fall of 2016.

Preserving Our Beloved Ago History

Did You Know:

- That we have newsletters dating back to 1927?
- That Ago occupied 4 houses in Potsdam until our House Mother, Anna Pierce, married Mr. Anderson, then owner of our beloved 11 Pierrepont and got us a better price to buy it?
- That 11P was not a funeral home but did have a kissing coop attached to the front door for courters to say goodnight?
- That Brownie's first name was Eunice and every Tuesday she served us chocolate covered peanuts with Donald Duck orange juice while we updated index cards on our Calliopean, Zeta Gamma Upsilon, Agonian alumnae?

I love my role as Historian, piecing together bits of our deep dark past. I enjoyed and may revisit my recent project of contacting our beloved Agonian sisters who graduated between 1946 and 1960, hoping to let them know they are important to us and receive wonderful stories of their days in Ago and at college. My committee member, **Donna Longenecker Neubauer '75**, continues to repair and restore composites, returning them to 11P each summer for reunion. She has restored and added fresh plexiglass to about 12 composites since 2015.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) About Dues?

How much are dues? How often do I pay?

Dues for Ago Alumnae Association are \$25 per calendar year. When you pay your dues, you are granted membership for the year in which you paid. If you pay more than \$25, you can specify how you would like that money allocated (scholarship, newsletter, reunion, house repair, kitchen renovation, etc.)

Why pay dues?

The AAA's largest budget item is the cost to print and mail the Anchor newsletter (about \$2000/year). To raise this much money, we have to have 80 sisters pay their \$25 dues. We still have nearly 200 alumnae who aren't on email or haven't shared email addresses with us. The ONLY communication they get from Ago is their annual newsletter. Most of these women graduated before 1980, and we don't want to lose them and their link to Ago's history. At some point, we will inevitably be forced to switch to an "email-only" Anchor, but we are hoping to continue to print it until it no longer becomes economically feasible. The second most expensive budget line is our annual scholarship to an Active Ago member. Each year, the membership votes on the size of the scholarship... which is generally around \$1000. To fund that, we need an additional 40 dues-paying members. Finally, we need another 40 members to cover miscellaneous items. This includes things like our share of the website cost, postage, thank you postcards, awards, charitable donations, small allotments for reunion costs and donations toward the Rush program, etc. Our dedicated volunteers also donate some of these items personally.

Do any other privileges come with paid membership?

Paying your dues allows you to become an officer on the AAA, vote for officers of the AAA, and cast votes at the annual meeting, held on the Saturday of Reunion Weekend.

What's NEW with dues in 2024?

Historically, we have been asking for dues all year long. We recently received a suggestion that perhaps we should have a more focused "membership drive". The officers have talked about this and have decided that in 2024 we will focus on promoting dues payment from the time the Anchor goes out, until the Summer Reunion. If we hit our goal by then (in 2023 we had 160 members), we will stop promoting dues until 2025. We are off to a good start, since nearly 50 members have joined in the first few months of the year, before we have really even started promoting dues payment. We thank the Class Reps for their part in promoting the early memberships!

What will be different in 2024?

In April, May and June, we will give some incremental reports on membership recruitment. They will be posted on Facebook and/or sent by email. We will let you know how close we are to our goal and give you some statistics on which classes have the best membership numbers (total and %) and which classes are excelling in "extra donations" (toward scholarship, newsletter, house repair, house renovation, etc.). At the annual meeting, we will announce "winning classes" (who earn bragging rights). It is not meant to be a serious competition, but just an attempt to stir up a little excitement and have fun while raising money that benefits the Alums, the Actives, and the House.

The AAA's greatest resource is our database, where we do our best to keep track of our Agonian Sisters so that we can keep them abreast of Ago events, and also connect them to old friends. Over the last few years, we have been working diligently on improving the database functionality and accuracy. We thought you might want to hear a little about our efforts and how you can help.



Geographical Regions:

We have completed an effort to add a "Geographic Region" to each alumnae. Most divisions are "by State", but for New York State, where most of our alumnae reside, we have subdivided into the economic development regions of the State. When we enter an address in the database, it now automatically assigns the proper region. We use that information to maintain mailing lists, so that if we want a mailing to target a certain geographic area, we don't have any searching and sorting to do. This has already come in handy for helping folks that have planned regional Ago get-togethers. If you would like to organize a local Ago event, simply send us the information and we can forward it to your target audience.



Missing Sisters:

We have a lot of "Missing Sisters". These include many sisters who are "alive and well", but have moved or changed email addresses and we can no longer reach them. Over the past years, we have made a concerted effort to search for these sisters and find new contact information: most of the missing graduated before the 1980s. **Sharon Cooney '78** has been a huge help this past year, sharing the genealogy skills that she honed during her 40 years working with Lorenzo State Historic Site. She has been able to identify many of our older sisters who have passed away so that we are able to recognize them in our "In Memoriam" section of the Anchor. The work of searching for the missing continues. You can help by scanning the names of the missing in the Class News and let us know if you have any information that might help us find them.

Colleen had served on the Agonian Board of Directors and/or our AAA for over 40 years. In her memory, Agonians donated funds to install a bench at Otsiningo Park in Binghamton, NY, plant a tree at 11 Pierrepont Avenue in Potsdam, NY, and raise funds for the Scleroderma Foundation.

During the AAA Annual meeting in July the leadership team presented the 2023 Agonian Alumnae Association Lifetime Achievement Award which was posthumously given on Colleen's behalf for all she did for Ago. The plaque is hung at 11P for all to see.

An Agonian to Remember Shirley Kincaid Eagan '64 (1942 - 2023)

The Agonians have lost a very special sister. Shirley Kincaid Eagan '64 was an active alumna. She was instrumental in organizing Ago Alumnae Luncheons in Skaneateles and was a regular attendee at the Potsdam Alumni Luncheon events in Naples, FL. Shirley had a reputation of being the "Pied Piper" of her Ago era. She knew everyone and loved to get people together. Shirley and Tom (her Clarkson alumni husband of 59 years) were ready and willing to help with the effort to re-launch Ago almost a decade ago.

Shirley died peacefully on October 19th, 2023 at the age of 81 after enduring a long illness with grace and dignity. Born and raised in Syracuse, NY, she was a graduate of West Genesee High School. She earned a bachelor's degree at SUNY Potsdam and a master's degree at Bowling Green State University. While at Potsdam, Shirley was very involved with Ago Sorority, serving as Sorority President in her Senior year.

As a teacher, Shirley was known for her creative methods of teaching and interjecting fun into every lesson. Her love of teaching was additionally fueled by her strong bond with many, many teacher friends.

Greeks Happily Ever After....

Jim Richardson (Sigma Chi, St. Lawrence '60), the husband of the late **Judy Herrick Richardson '61**, answered our call for memorabilia last year and sent some pictures. He also shared some wonderful memories of his life with our sister Judy, and since Agonian was an important aspect of their lives together, he continues to enjoy the news of the Sisters of '61.

James writes:

"I met Judy on a blind date in 1957, set up by a fraternity brother who was dating an Agonian. We married in 1961 (after Judy graduated) in the village of Owasco, NY, her hometown. Agonian sister, **Kay Ney Brunner** '62 was one of her bridesmaids.

Judy taught near Syracuse while I was getting a Masters at Syracuse University, and later at the Rantoul Air Force Base in Illinois where I obtained my PhD in archaeology. We moved to Pittsburgh, PA for my position as an Assistant Professor at the University of Pittsburgh. I'm an Anthropologist; I've worked in Central NY, Western PA, Martha's Vineyard, and Peru. In 1978, I took a half-time position at the Carnegie Museum of Natural History in the section of Anthropology. After Illinois, Judy didn't teach again.

Judy was an integral part of my archaeological career at the University of Pittsburgh and Carnegie Museum of Natural History supporting my academic and museum research in a myriad of ways while raising our two children Heather and James. From going into the field in 1965 to Talara in northern Peru for my dissertation research, living for a year there in 1972 with our children for further research and hosting graduate students at our house on Martha's Vineyard while excavating sites on the Island. She organized receptions at our Pittsburgh home for museum exhibit openings and hosted colleagues and students. Judy was a true life's partner. Sadly, Judy passed away from cancer on December 3, 2019. Her obituary is in the Vineyard Gazette which can be accessed on the web. I treasure the years we had at college together."


